

GDPR Commitment Statement

The EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) replaces the 1995 EU Data Protection Directive and strengthens the rights of EU individuals in relation to their personal data.

Continental Ltd (TA Webnetism) will comply with all applicable GDPR regulations as a data controller and data processor. We are working with our clients to ensure they too are meeting their GDPR obligations.

We are committed to address EU data protection requirements applicable to us as a data controller and a data processor. Over the last year we have worked to ensure we have appropriate provisions for the personal data we store, and balance the risks and responsibilities between data controllers and data processors.

The GDPR includes requirements on data controllers for the portability of personal data. Data stored on our servers or transacted through our network by our clients belongs to our clients and they remain the data controller. We provide for portability of data through database extracts and backups and are continually working to enhance the robustness of our export capabilities.

Data we store is held entirely in the United Kingdom.

We will continue to make additional operational changes resulting from new legislation, and will keep our clients and partners informed throughout as we adapt to the requirements of the GDPR. We will continue to monitor GDPR as it becomes more clearly defined and will strive to meet or exceed the requirements set out.
